## STUDENT ACTIVITIES

### PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

### **BOOK POLICY**

At the beginning of each school year, students may be issued textbooks marked with book numbers. Students will sign for each book and will be responsible for covering it and keeping it in good condition.

At the end of each school year, the books will be collected and signed off. Book numbers must match the original book number received. If books are returned in poor condition or are lost, penalties will apply.

### **BAGS AND BACKPACKS STUDENTS**

Students are expected to come to school prepared each day. Students should carry their notebooks, folders, and any other necessary school supplies in a backpack or backpack. Students arriving at school without necessary school supplies are considered unprepared and parents may be notified.

### **DRESS CODE**

To ensure the safety and reputation of our students, ALL students must adhere to the FDA CodeVI dress

- with our logo sewn on or any light blue/black collared shirt or t-shirt without the school logo.
  - No sleeves or crop tops are prohibited including exposure of skin
  - Blue or black hoodies are allowed; however, students are not allowed to have the "hood" portion of the sweater on their heads.
  - Du-rags, hats, caps, bandanas, and beanies are not permitted.
  - Seniors will be allowed to wear special senior gear
- Shoes/sneakers Flip-
  - Flops and slippers are prohibited, however crocs are allowed except in PE

Although there is no specific pants policy, pants must not sag below the waist.
